2020-2021 Overview

Hamilton Tastebuds Student Nutrition Collaborative is a partnership of community agencies and community members that supports and facilitates local Student Nutrition Programs (SNPs) for children and youth in Hamilton.

The COVID-19 pandemic has significantly impacted students and their ability to access healthy, nutritious food through regular SNPs.

While SNPs were able to operate during times when in-person learning was permitted, the switch to virtual learning presented new challenges for ensuring students had access to nutritious food while learning from home.

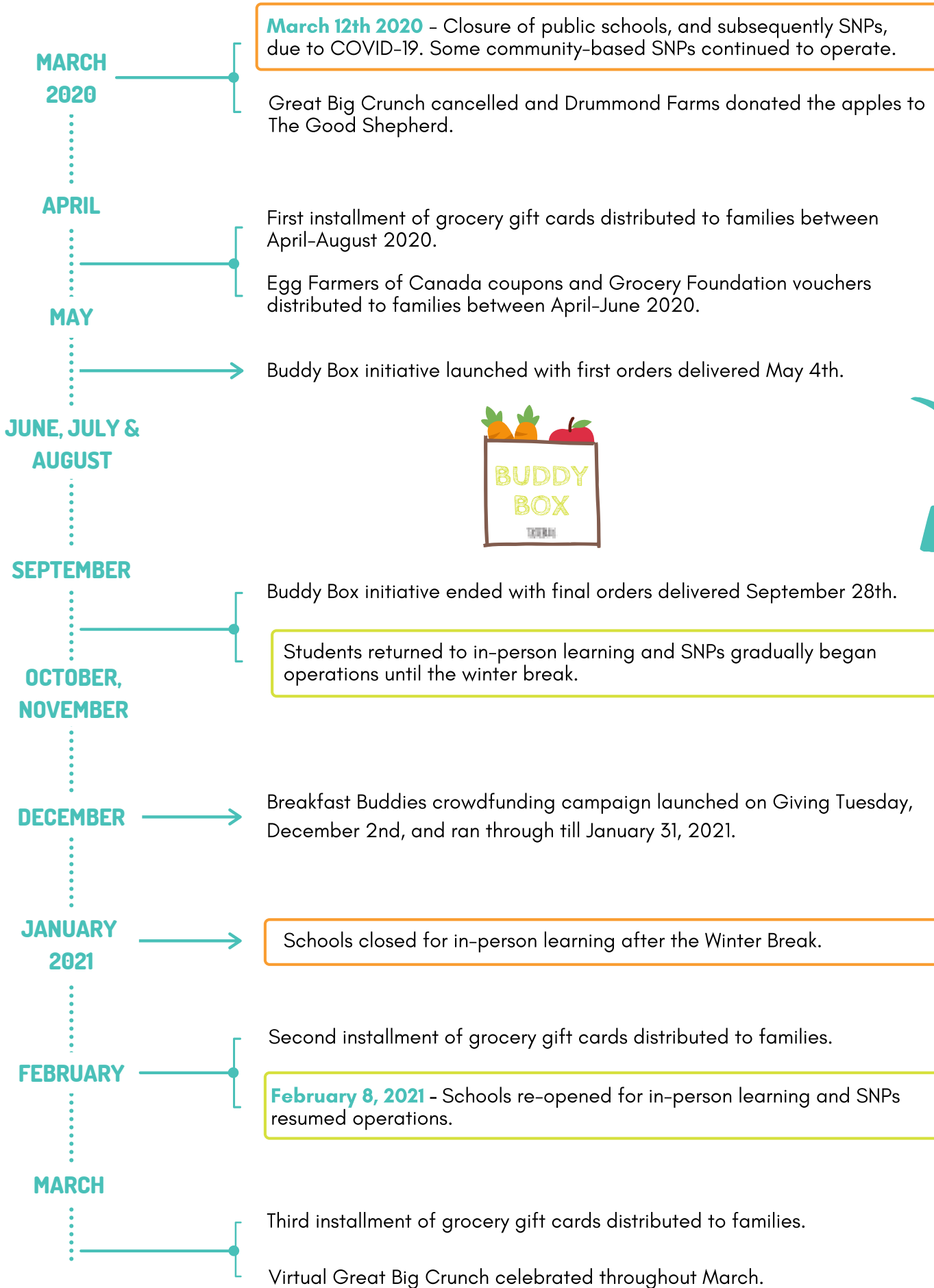

Modifications to SNPs were made in collaboration with Hamilton Public Health, the Hamilton-Wentworth District School Board, the Hamilton-Wentworth Catholic District School Board, and Haldimand-Norfolk R.E.A.C.H., to ensure that programs could continue to operate safely while adhering to new COVID-19 protocols.

Modifications:

- increased use of pre-packaged food to decrease food preparation on site
- programs scaled down to be more manageable for limited volunteers
- limited number of volunteers permitted onsite
- in-person grocery shop reduced
- adhering to safety protocols including physical distancing and enhanced cleaning and sanitizing procedures

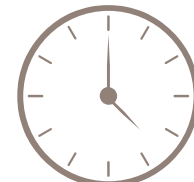

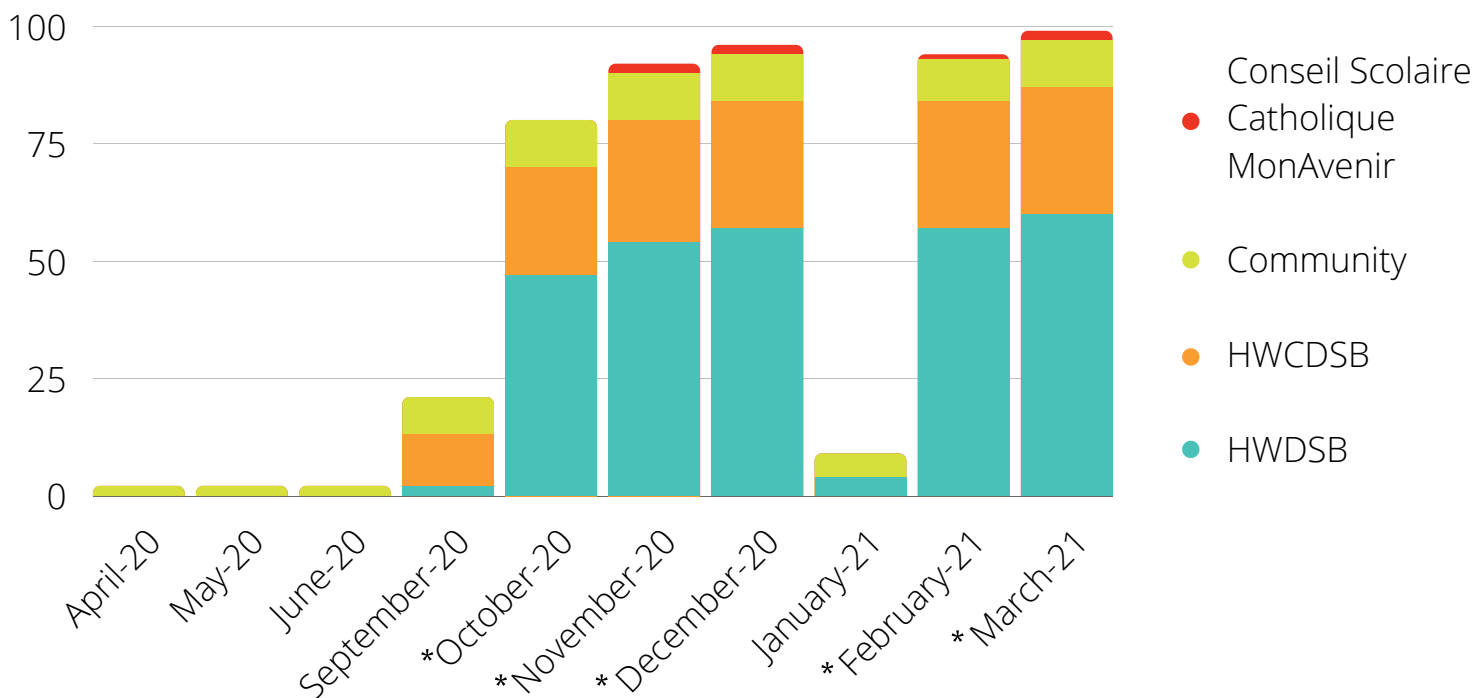

Great Big Crunch

The Great Big Crunch is a national movement and annual moment of anti-silence in which students, teachers, parents and others passionate about healthy food join the food movement and crunch into apples (or another crunchy fruit/vegetable) to make noise for healthy school food.

This year due to COVID-19 related restrictions Tastebuds encouraged students and community members to participate online through the Virtual Great Big Crunch. Photos and videos of crunches were shared online throughout the entire month of March in place of in-person events that would normally be organized.

Virtual Learner Support

Grocery Gift Cards

In response to the initial closure of schools in March of 2020, Tastebuds worked with the Hamilton-Wentworth District School Board, the Hamilton-Wentworth Catholic District School Board, staffs at CSC Mon Avenir schools as well as staffs at community organizations to distribute grocery gift cards to students and their families.

This process was repeated twice more following the transition to online learning in January of 2021. Distribution of the gift cards was heavily supported by school boards. School and community organization staff identified families to receive support and distributed the grocery gift cards to students.

Funding was provided by The Ministry of Children, Community and Social Services. Grocery gift cards supplied by the Grocery Foundation from the Toonies for Tummies campaign were distributed in February 2021.

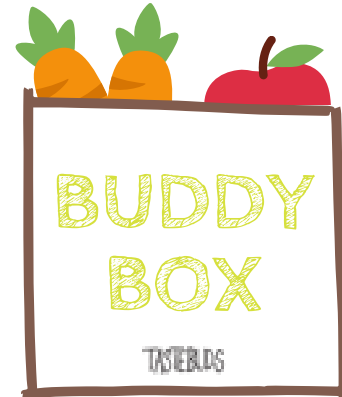
The Buddy Box Initiative

In May of 2020, Tastebuds partnered with local food banks and a local food vendor, MZ Foods, to create the “Buddy Box”. Healthy foods were delivered directly to the food banks in either pre-made “Buddy Boxes” or “In Bulk” to be distributed to families with school aged children. This was in addition to what the families would normally receive from the food bank.

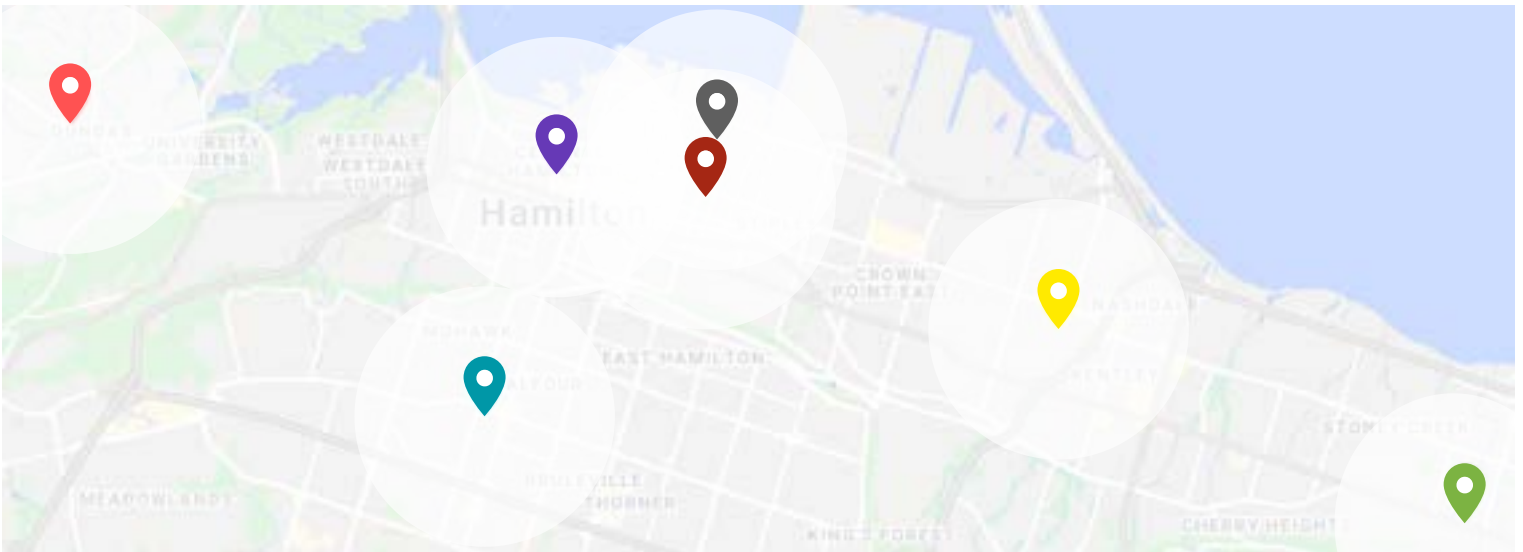

Grocery Foundation Grocery Vouchers

In collaboration with Tastebuds, HN-REACH and The Grocery Foundation, Tastebuds was able to purchase grocery vouchers for school's student nutrition program. Due to school closures, these were donated to Food4Kids Hamilton to be distributed to students and their families across Hamilton. School nutrition programs were also permitted to distribute any unused Grocery Foundation Vouchers to families in addition to grocery gift cards. Vouchers were distributed from April to June 2020.

Egg Farmers of Canada Coupons

Tastebuds receives donation of egg coupons from Egg Farmers of Canada every year. Each egg coupon is valid for one carton of eggs. In 2019-20, we partnered with the Good Shepherd Venture Centre, Food4Kids Hamilton and Dawn Patrol to distribute Egg Farmers of Canada egg coupons to families from April to June of 2020. Nutrition programs were permitted to distribute unused Egg Farmers of Canada Coupons to families in addition to grocery gift cards.

Donated product from Breakfast Club of Canada were delivered to student nutrition programs.

Participating locations received yogurt, applesauce and/or hard-boiled eggs on a regular basis to serve in their SNP.
